

**GETTING THERE** 

Nice Cote d'Azur International Airport is the second largest in France, positioned 7 kilometers (4 miles) west of the city center, and is the principal port of arrival for passengers to the Cote d'Azur. Due to its proximity to the Principality of Monaco (a 30-minute drive), it also serves as that country's airport. One of the most exciting ways to kick off an incentive program in Monaco is arranging a helicopter transfer through Monaco Air, which is a quick 10-minute flight over the gorgeous waters.

HOTELS

The area has many four- and five-star properties, with some of the most glorious perched in the heart of Monaco. The Le Meridien Beach Plaza is a four-star, 397-room resort right on the sea—and the only hotel in the area with a private beach.

The Hermitage is a five-star hotel with 280 rooms and suites and 10 meeting rooms. The on-site restaurant, Le Vistamar, has views of the sea and is 1 Michelin Star rated. It sits adjacent to the Grand Casino in the middle of the hustle and bustle.

Hotel Negresco, a five-star hotel in Nice, is one of the most interesting hotels in the region. Its collection of art is eclectic and downright funky, and the property serves as a museum of sorts for the eccentric owners' private collection. Each of the 96 guest rooms is different, filled with antique furniture and inspired by periods of French art—from art deco to baroque to classical.

## WATER ACTIVITIES

In an area surrounded by water, activities on said water are a must. Boule d'Energie is a teambuilding company that specializes in groups, with a fleet of boats and a talented team ready to make your day of adventure one to remember.
